Bridging Cultures: 'Together: Poetic Asian Hands' Unveils Fusion of Artistry

The moment we live in now requires empathy, and art and culture are great mediums for conveying sensory and visual emotional expressions from different places on the same planet. The exhibition, "Together: Poetic Asian Hand," features captivating works of 11 talented Asian artists spanning jewelry, textile art, paper art, and music. These works blend harmoniously to create an Asian-inspired oasis within a Nordic backdrop, all under the same roof.

The craft culture in Finland has been vividly connected with the outside world in the past. For example, the ceramic company Arabia sent designer Friedl Holzer-Kjellberg to learn Chinese porcelain methods in the town of Jingde Zheng. Finnish artists and designers such as Helene Schjerfbeck, Albert Edelfelt, Rut Bruk, Heidi Blomstedt, and many others were very popular in Japan. Many Finnish designers went to Japan to gain inspiration for their work.

For the theme of this exhibition, we have been inspired by how Finland, in the past, connected with the international art scene. The Artek gallery, in its day, held various exhibitions connected to Asia: Japan in 1958, India, Nepal, and Thailand in 1970, and the Chinese Market in 1975 and 1981.

In this exhibition, we create a story that weaves tradition together with the contemporary. We also want to explore different techniques using the same material to create tension and cultural impact. For example, Finland is famous for creating everyday life design objects. If we think of enamel, we can recall Kaj Franck's enamel bowl manufacturing by Arabia. In Asia, enamel is a material used in decorative art objects like cloisonné enamel. In this exhibition, you can see Taiwanese artist Kuo I-Hsuan masterfully incorporating natural landscapes into her pieces through the use of delicate enamel.

Due to artists' talent and emotion, each artist chooses materials that correspond to things and themselves, expressing their own philosophy through techniques and aesthetics.

Before participating in an international art exhibition, Finnish abstract art pioneer Ahti Lavonen remarked, "I have found that the essence of what Finland can offer to the world is a sense of emptiness."

At Gallery Gao Shan, we aim to recreate this unique Finnish experience by transforming our space to resemble a classic Finnish home. In this exhibition, we showcase the rich craftsmanship of foreign artists, highlighting their skillful artistry and the magic of their handiwork.

Diverse artists with distinct approaches to their art

Chia-Hung Kao, a distinguished printmaker and art educator with a doctorate from TNNUA, has gained recognition through awards like the First Prize at the Japan Enamelling Artist Association Exhibition. His work, showcased in solo shows like 'Thank You for Your Wait," blends fine printmaking with personal and cultural narratives." In a rapidly changing, indifferent world, he clings to memory fragments, using printmaking to capture fleeting moments and emotions. His art, a blend of personal history and vivid representation, acts as a bridge between the transient present and a resonant past.







Youzhi Bi, a talented Chinese artist, graduated from the Royal Academy of Fine Arts, Antwerp, with a focus on jewelry design. Embracing imperfections, she uses thin, delicate silver for her nature-inspired sketches, transforming these into unique brooches. In her "Trace Series," she merges drawing and metalwork, where initial scratches on the silver evolve from mistakes to integral parts of the story, symbolizing nature's unpredictability.











Heng Lee, founder of Heng Lee Jewelry and a 2011 TN-NUA graduate, has gained international recognition for his contemporary designs. Amal Yung-huei Chao is interested in the relationship between jewellery and human body. In many cultures jewellery is viewed as an asset and worn for personal implementation. I use this statement to build structures onto the body; just as the human body carries emotions and feelings, which are conveyed onto the body surface as marks and symbols. These are traces of lives lived, reflections of the person who wears them. Jewellery shares the same characteristics but in a temporary and changeable format. Dismantled roofing sheets covered in traces are the formation of time. Sheets are folded to form spaces and fabricated to grow and settle on the body as wearable pieces. Movement between each element provides a visually unstable and fragile perception, while friction between movement accumulate traces, resonating the everyday ordinary. What defines home?



Mei-Fang Chiang graduated from National Taiwan University of Art and MFA in Metal smithing and Jewelry at Graduate Institute of Applied Arts Tainan National University of the Arts. She has worked with aluminum as a major material for a long time. Through different techniques, Chiang transforms aluminum which is considered a cheap and practical material, into a new, spiritual light.

The Hidden Tree Series made from discarded plywood rolled on aluminum. After rolling, the torn texture of the wood flake leaves traces on the metal, like an unknown tree being shaped by various external forces from afar, and has lost the clues that can be identified. She use metal to simulate the appearance of trees being cut down, rearranged, and stacked, showing the life course of the trees as they leave the forest.

The reading face series contains nine different shaped pieces may be assembled into a variety of transformative-characters. The act of dismantling and reassembling conveys the process of revealing the diversity of presentation.








